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SAN DIEGO — ChemoCentryx, Inc., of San Carlos California, is being awarded a \$5,677,082 cost-plus-fixed-fee-type contract for research and development of pathogen countermeasures and advanced medical diagnostics having greatest impact on the protection of personnel during military operations. The contract efforts will primarily support the Defense Advanced Research Project Agency's (DARPA) Defense Sciences Office, Unconventional Pathogenic Countermeasures (UPC) program. This is a two-year contract, with basic tasks to be performed within 24 months and an option to perform an additional task starting at the end of the first year for a 12-month period. If the option is exercised, the total cumulative value of this contract will be \$6,420,155. All work will be performed in San Carlos, California. The period of performance is from June 25, 2001 through June 25, 2003. Contract funds obligated in the amount of \$1,847,355 will not expire at the end of the current fiscal year. This contract was competitively procured, having been published in the Commerce Business Daily under DARPA BAA# 00-33 and posted in CBDNet April 12, 2001.
