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### **SPAWAR Awards Contract to Cal. State University Foundation**

**SAN DIEGO** — California State University Long Beach Foundation\* is being awarded a \$7,664,332 indefinite-delivery/indefinite-quantity-type contract to conduct research to identify emerging transportation requirements and their potential technological solutions in support of dual use commercial and military applications. This research will enhance the ability of the Department of Defense to move vital goods rapidly into and out of port facilities in the event of a wide-scale military mobilization. Additionally, this research has great potential for commercial benefit through enhanced efficiency of commercial port operations. This is a one-year contract with no options. The period of performance is from Sept. 19, 2002 to Sept. 18, 2003. Work will be performed in Long Beach, California (35%), McLean, Virginia (12%), Honolulu, Hawaii (11%), Severna Park, Maryland (11%), Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania (11%), San Francisco (6%), Bremerton, Washington (5%), Essex, Connecticut (4%), Annapolis, Maryland (3%), Southampton, Hampshire, and United Kingdom (2%). Contract funds will not expire at the end of the current fiscal year. This contract was procured on a sole-source basis under the authority of 10 USC 2304(c)(1). This is follow-on to previous work performed under the Center for Commercial Deployment of Transportation Technologies program. The Space and Naval Warfare Systems Center San Diego is the contracting activity (N66001-02-D-0039).
